# British City's Gift For Nigerian Flying Doctor Service

LONDON - The Flying Doctor Service of Nigeria has reached a "turning point" in its fortunes and it is now fairly certain that flying will start in April. This is what the doctor's wife, Mrs. Duncan, told the Plymouth Branch of the International Friendship League to see her England last week, when receiving a cheque for £290 to buy a radio for the village of Kaingwa, in Northern Nigeria.

The Plymouth Branch has "adopted" the village and the cheque was presented by its President, Mr. Ritchie Symons.

"I am happy and proud to be making this presentation. It was a delight to raise the money for something which helps the sick here said.

Accepting the cheque, Mrs. Duncan said she "new what pleasure the gift would give in Nigeria. She went on: 'Thank you for your generosity, and for your personal interest. We are powerless without the help of people like yourselves.'

Explaining that the radio would enable the dispenser at Kaingwa to get expert medical advice on the treatment of his patients, she promised to keep the Plymouth Branch of the League in touch with developments.

The Nigerian chairman of the Plymouth Branch, Mr. Frank Agyemeng from Onitsha, who is studying civil engineering in Britain told an L.D.S. correspondent he understood and appreciated the effects which the Flying Doctor Service could have in Nigeria.

The Service, launched in Nigeria by Dr. Neil Duncan of Birmingham, is sponsored in Britain by the 'Freedom from Hunger' organisation. Campaigning all over the country by local organisers and youth groups has so far raised a total of over £55,000 for the Service which will also carry agricultural and veterinary services to remote districts.

Some of these funds have been ear-marked towards a new plane to replace one bought with

O.X.F.A.M. funds which was damaged by storm in Nigeria and a second, damaged before reaching Nigeria.

Now a new gift has come from Switzerland to make up the balance £6,500 from the Swiss drug firm of Geigy.

## Indiscriminate Arrests In Kash-mir

NEW DELHI... Indiscriminate arrests are being made in Srinagar, Baramulla and from other places in the Valley, according to a diplomatic informant here.

The new flare-up of popular revolt began on Friday the 24th January, when thousands prayed and wept in Srinagar, Jama Masjid, a Grand Mosque, lamenting the loss of the Prophet's holy hair.

Fearing that the congregation might demonstrate in the city, Indian Armed Police brought in front Rajasthan blocked their path and forced them into

by-lanes. Several people were beaten and at least two received bayonet wounds, though not serious.

## Pakistan To Buy Four Ships From Yugoslavia

RAWALPINDI-Pakistan would shortly buy four ships from Yugoslavia, which had been offered on credit.

Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission, Mr. Said Hasan, told newsmen today that Pakistan had already signed an agreement with Yugoslavia for buying two ships, out of dollar five million loan.

Another agreement for buying two more ships was ready to be signed, under which Yugoslavia would extend a dollar-five million loan to Pakistan.

## Marsh: Director Of British Manage- ment Institute

The Direct of the British Institute of Management, Mr. John Marsh, will address the Annual Conference of the Nigerian Institute of Management which is being held at the Mainland Hotel, Lagos from February 27-29. Mr Marsh will speak on "MANAGEMENT AS A TOOL FOR INCREASING PRODUCTIVITY" and on "THE ROLE OF AN INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT".

He will also present the Nigerian Institute of Management with a set of British books on the art of management. The book are the gift of Britain's Council for Technical Education and Training for Overseas Countries, of which he is a member.

Mr. Marsh will fly to Kano on February 23 and expects to visit Kaduna and Zaria before journeying to Lagos for the Conference. After the Conference he hopes to visit Ibadan. He returns to London on March 3.

### Extensive Experience

Mr. Marsh has carried out extensive lecturing and study tours in Europe and other parts of the world. In 1953 he visited India and Pakistan and again visited these countries in 1957 and 1963. He also lectured in Canada and the United States in 1958 and 1960.

Before the war Mr Marsh worked for the Austin Motor Company, he served from 1939-1946 in the Royal Army Service Corps and became a prisoner of war in Japan.

Demobilised as a Major he joined BOAC as a personnel officer. In 1947 he was appointed Director of the Institute of Personnel Management and two years later he became Director of the Industrial Welfare Society. He held this post until 1951 when he took up his present appointment.

He is at present a member of the BBC Advisory Council and has been Honorary Advisor of the Development of the Study Conference Committee of Voluntary Organisations Overseas and of the International National Conference on Social Work.

He has written a number of books and articles on different aspects of the art of management.

# Programmes For West Africa A Man, A Guiter, And A Bus

It is often thought that there is little chance today for the individualist among the teeming millions of a vast city like London, but there is a character there called Calypso Sam who proves that this theory is wrong. His story was told in a BBC African Service programme by Andrew Salkey, the novelist who said:

"Calypso Sam is a singer with a definite plan. He once told me: 'I am one entertainer with a difference. When I sing I like to know that my message reaches out to the whole wide world. If I sing in night-club, I can only get my song across to a limited audience. So I prefer to sing on the top of those nice red London buses; I can capture thousands like that.'

Salkey went on to describe Calypso Sam's plan, which was both methodical and professional. He always chose his bus route carefully—the busier the better. He sat at the back of the top deck and then played his guitar and sang for all he was worth.

Sam may have exaggerated his account to make a better story but he would explain. "Man, this London is the last remaining paradise for rugged individualists like me. You take a tip from Speakers' Corner in Hyde Park and you can't go wrong in London. In fact, you never reach the top in Britain in any activity until you learn to go out on a limb, express yourself loud and clear and stick to your plan mad as it may be."

### The Art Of Finding Out

Some people are good at memorising facts; others are good at finding out facts when they are needed. Which of these two facilities is most likely to lead to success? Suzanne Cronje, speaking in the BBC

African Service programme FOR PARENTS AND TEACHERS, thought that a recent memory, though very useful, was less important than the ability to collect and make use of information.

Miss Cronje illustrated her argument by telling BBC listeners the true story of the university lecture who was asked by a student for an unusual piece of information:

He replied that he was not sure about that particular point but would supply the answer the following day. The student, who was not her modest nor wise, turned away with a contemptuous smile and remarked quite suddenly that if those who were paid to instruct him were themselves lacking in education, he was wasting his time.

The lecturer called him back and said: "Young man, you wish to ascertain a fact, but you went about it the wrong way. You asked me, although I was there to enlighten you, which proves that you don't know how to acquire information."

Tomorrow, I shall possess the information because I know where to look for facts. The difference between your approach and mine is the difference between ignorance and education."
