United Kingdom Trade Commissioner In British West Africa Appointed

The need for direct official representation in British West Africa, in commercial matters, have resulted in the appointment of Mr. Daniel Rowland as United Kingdom Trade Commissioner for West Africa, with Headquarters at Lagos.

Mr. Rowland met the members of the House on Saturday, June 27, 1953, and explained the duties and set out any of his own office.

The Trade Commissioner's functions are extremely varied and will cover all subjects having any bearing whatsoever on the development of exports from

Britain to West Africa. This means that not only will he be trying, for example, to establish contacts between United Kingdom manufacturers and West African importers or agents, but he will also be concerned with practically every aspect of trade life and will endeavour to keep British firms and the Board of Trade continually informed of all changes and developments in the way of life, habits, customs, buying power and tastes of the West African population, as well as details of all small or large-scale development projects here, in order that Britain may be able to keep abreast of current opportunities in this market in which she is very keenly interested.

In other words, the Trade Commissioner is the Economic Adviser to the Board of Trade in Britain on all matters pertaining to these territories.

Britain's Trade Commissioner service covers the whole of the British Commonwealth and Empire, but in some places where no Trade Commissioner is actually resident, honorary Imperial Trade Correspondents of the Board of Trade perform the necessary functions. That has been the position hitherto in British West Africa and, up to now, the Department of Commerce and Industries in Nigeria has acted as Imperial Trade Correspondent of the Board of Trade. In future, all questions relating to export trade FROM BRITAIN TO NIGERIA should be addressed to the Trade Commissioner, who will be glad to assist to the best of his ability any commercial man who submits their queries to him. Matters con-

cerning NIGERIAN EXPORTS TO BRITAIN, however, will continue to be dealt with by the Department of Commerce and Industries.

Britain Becomes A Mecca For Research

LONDON—A great inflow of visitors to Britain from all over the world to study her agricultural methods suggests that the country which for generations has pioneered industrial advance is taking on a new role as Mecca of agriculture.

Visitors from East Africa, Nigeria and South Africa took great interest in modern agricultural implements and machines exhibited at the Bath and West Agricultural Show—the first of the big summer shows in the U.K. They visited farms showing the Ferguson system of complete farm mechanisation and were anxious to see the wide range of modern implements which are incorporated in the system. Attendance at the Show was over 30,000—17,000 more than last year. Visitors from all over the world were present.

Two chiefs from the northern provinces of Nigeria who are members of the House of Chiefs have arrived in London by air to see, in person, what the British agricultural methods and local government, under arrangements made by the British Council.

They are, Mallam Ahmadu, the 10th Lompo of Adamawa, and the Emir of Gombe. Each is accompanied by an official of the Native government. Mr. B. P. W. Murray, District Officer of Gombe, is escorting the chiefs throughout this visit.

500,000 dollars Foundation which was established by the late American industrialist, Henry Ford, and his son, Edsel Ford.

The fund for Adult Education will seek to expand educational opportunities for adults who want to continue their formal education. In this manner it will be promoting the ultimate objective of the Ford Foundation as stated in the 1950 report:

"Education must meet the need of the human spirit. It must assist persons to develop a satisfactory personal philosophy and sense of values, to cultivate tools for literature, music and the arts; and to grow in ability to analyse problems and arrive at thoughtful conclusions."

The second of the two objectives, the Fund for the Advancement of Education, will study the objectives and procedures of education in elementary and secondary schools and in universities. Experimentation will play an important part in the studies. One of the first experiments will begin next September. It is designed to test the mental abilities of students less than 163 who have completed the tenth grade.
