### U.S. SCHOLAR TO STUDY ANCIENT AFRICAN CIVILIZATIONS

WASHINGTON — A scholar of African antiquities will leave the United States for Cairo on August 25 to begin studies of the ancient African civilizations which flourished in Egypt, the Sudan, Ethiopia and areas of the Sudan.

Dr. William J. G. Easton, history professor in the Department of History at Howard University, has been awarded a year's research grant under the Fulbright Program.

### FINANCIAL TIMES DISCUSSES PROBLEMS OF REGIONALISED MARKETING BOARDS

The Nigerian constitution committee proposals for a local committee to control the financial problems arising from any new federal government structure are the subject of a four article in Tuesday's Financial Times.

The article draws special attention to the future of the Marketing Boards and the difficulties of maintaining a common policy should the boards pass to regional control. Says the Financial Times Correspondent: "All the four boards are extremely wealthy and the region 1 governments will each want to control its regional board". The article also asks how selling operations could be carried out if each board should seek to formulate its own selling policy. It is not, it is to judge from the comments of some of the present day leaders this is always a "certainty".

The article concludes by saying that the boards are unique in their success as part of the colonial economic planning, their failure, therefore, is a matter of considerable speculation.

### THE QUEEN APPROVES WESTERN REGIONAL LAWS

According to the latest Gazette, the Secretary of State for the Colonies has notified that Her Majesty will not exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the Western Regional Laws No. 2 of 1953.

### The London Conference

The Conference on the Nigerian Constitution resumed its plenary session on Tuesday morning and afternoon and 10 Carlton House Terrace, under the chairmanship of the Secretary of State, Mr. Oliver Lyttelton.

The Conference continued their discussion on the structure of the central government.

The Secretary of State proposed the Conference that he prepared the Conference to be informed with the representatives from the Cameroons and would inform the Conference in the light of this meeting what arrangements he considered appropriate for the Cameroons under United Kingdom Trusteeship having regard to His Majesty's Government's responsibilities for the Trust Territories.

### LIBYAN PRIME MINISTER WELCOMES TREATY

The Libyan Prime Minister warmly defended the Anglo-Libyan treaty in a speech to the Libyan Parliament at Tripoli on 4th Aug. He said "I am proud to say that our obligations resulting from the treaty do not affect at all our obligations as an independent Arab League and do not contradict their obligations".

After outlining the provisions of the treaty he said signature of these documents has been made after negotiations and after agreement has been reached regarding the articles of the treaty under conditions of complete equality. The signed documents do not include any obligations which will subject Libya to any administrative financial control or any other sort of control.

It is only and two agreements between two free and independent countries on equal footing. Cooperation between ourselves and Britain will enable our Government and future Libyan Government to work for the economic stability of our country and to raise the standard of living of the people and their production so as to enable the country to achieve economic independence at the earliest possible time.

### A A Ajibade Dies At The Age Of 54
