The Week In The British Parliament

(By L P S Parliament Correspondent)

LONDON — With the next few weeks, Parliament will be immersed in debates on the Defence Budget for 1961-65 and the preliminary estimates of Civil Expenditure in the next financial year.

By the time the Defence Budget is published, the Prime Minister, Sir Alec Douglas-Home, will be in Washington for his discussions on February 12 and 13 with President Johnson to be preceded by his meeting in Ottawa with the Canadian Prime Minister.

Meanwhile both Houses are being kept mainly occupied with minor legislation and debates on domestic topics. The principal debate in the House of Commons today will be on education policy. This debate will take place on an Opposition motion which is crucial of what is described as "gaps in the Government's education programme."

The Government already are accelerating their proposed big expansion of facilities for higher education, in universities and in colleges which specialize in science and technology. There is room for argument about the priorities to be allotted in carrying through this ambitious education programme and this is what today's debate will be about.

East Africa and Malaya

Although there were no debates on any of these subjects, M.P.'s were much preoccupied during the past week with the disturbing incidents in some Commonwealth countries in East Africa and also with the developments affecting Malaya and Indonesia.

The Secretary of State for Commonwealth Relations, Mr Duncan Sandys, made a series of statements to the House of Commons on these subjects at intervals in his other task of residing at the Cyprus

Coffee Club. Mr. Sandys' statement about relations between Malaya and Indonesia was made the day before Mr. Robert Kennedy's arrival in London for talks with British Ministers about his recent efforts at mediation between Malaya and Indonesia. Mr. Kennedy was the Prime Minister's guest at Chequers recently and met also

Mr. Sandys and the Foreign Secretary and the Minister of Defence, who has himself recently visited Malaya to study the military situation.

Prime Ministers' Conference

The Prime Minister was questioned by two Opposition Members in the Commons about the possibility of arranging a Commonwealth Prime Minister's Conference in 1964. He replied that no plans had yet been made for such a meeting but that he would certainly consider, with the other Prime Ministers, "the case for a Commonwealth Prime Ministers' Conference this year."

He emphasised that this was a matter for joint decision by all the Prime Ministers of the Commonwealth. Mr. Bottomley from the Opposition Front Bench, inquired whether the Government had made a positive approach to other Commonwealth Governments with a view of convening a conference the Prime Minister replied: "I am considering whether I shall take an initiative myself in this matter."



B.B.C. Features Discovery Of River The Niger

LONDON-A British authority on West African history will tell radio listeners all over the world the story of the discovery of the source of the River Niger a BBC programme this month.

He is Mr. Reuben Hallett who was based in Zaria from 1956-59, is resident tutor in Northern Nigeria for the Extra-Mural Department of University College, Ibadan.

The discoverers featured in Mr. Hallett's talk in the General Overseas Service of the BBC were the Cornish-born brothers Richard and John Lander. In 1830 they explored the River Niger and found its long-sought after delta and the talk will be based on the journal kept by the brothers.

Mr. Hallett, who now lectures frequently for the Royal Commonwealth Society and the School of Oriental and African Studies in London, has written a book on "The European" to be published in Britain later this year.

His BBC talk—"The Riddle of the Niger" will be broadcast on Sunday, February 16 at 10.35 a.m. and on Monday, February 17 at 8.45 p.m.

"Fulani" Maiden Voyage To West Africa

LONDON—A new British cargo ship, the Elder

Dempster Lines m.v. "Fulani" starts her maiden voyage from Liverpool tomorrow, Thursday, for a number of West African ports.

The "Fulani" (7,689 gross tons) has a crew of 46 men and was built by Messrs Lithgow of Port Glasgow where she was launched in June 1963. The ship will be under the command of Captain C. S. H. O'Sullivan.

The port of call on her maiden voyage will be Freetown, Sierra Leone, Monrovia and Lower Buchanan in Liberia, Takoradi and Tema in Ghana, Lome in Togo, and Apapa, Burutu, Sapelle and Warri in Nigeria.

The ship is the third Elder Dempster vessel to be named after the Fulani tribe. She will operate at a service speed of 16 knots propelled by a single screw driven by a Fairfield-Sulzer engine.

The "Fulani" is the fourth of six ships of a new design to be built by the Elder Dempster Liner to meet the latest requirements of the West African trade. Two further ships, the "Freetown" and "Fian" will shortly enter service.
