Applications are invited from qualified candidates for a limited number of vacancies in a 3 year residential course at the Yaba Technical Institute commencing on the 1st October, 1951. Applicants must not be over 15 years of age on 1st January, 1951 and they must be in possession of either a Government Standard VI or a Government Secondary II pass certificate. Applicants will be required to submit evidence of age and educational standard.

Selection of applicants for these vacancies will be made on the result of an open competitive examination and personal interview to be held in Ibadan, Benin and Lagos on the following dates:

- IBADAN --- July 18th and 20th 1951.
- BENIN --- --- 23rd " 25th "
- LAGOS --- --- 30th " August 1st 1951.

Fees for the course are £15 per annum payable termly at the rate of £5 per term. Fees are payable in advance and selected candidates will not be permitted to attend until the fee has been paid.

Application forms may be obtained from the Provincial Education Offices at Ibadan, Benin and Lagos. THEY CAN NOT BE OBTAINED FROM THE PRINCIPAL, TECHNICAL INSTITUTE. 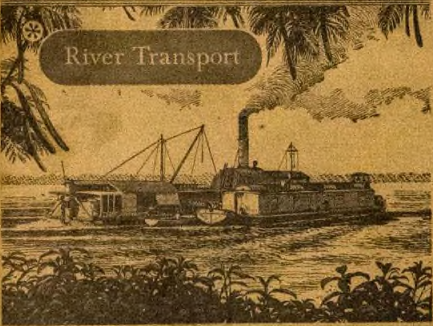
