

OLD GRAMMARIAN'S SOCIETY.

(Literary and Debating Section.)

A successful debate was held at the Grammar School on Thursday February 22nd. As the Chairman of the Section was one of the speakers, the President of the Society the Rev. E. J. Evans took the chair in his stead. The motion before the House was "That the influence of the Lagos Press is not wholly for good." There was a large attendance of between 70 and 80 including visitors, and the audience included several gentlemen connected with the local Press.

The Proposer was Mr. C. H. Olatunyiwa gave a fluent and earnest speech. He limited the word "Press" to newspapers and called attention to the terms of the motion. The word "Wholly" implied that there was some good in our newspapers. He took the local papers one by one and criticised them impartially through severely.

The "Nigerian Pioneer" was considered by the people as being merely the organ of the Government. A newspaper ought to create public opinion but could the N.P. do this if it is always for the Government and not for the people? The African Messenger, with which the Hon. Opposer was connected (loud laughter) said No. Therefore its influence was not wholly for good. He stated that the Eleko and Franchise difficulties were largely due to newspapers and their Editors.

The "Messenger" also came in for criticism. It had led people one way on the Eleko question and then had turned completely round. Was this good? The Lagos Weekly Record he thought tried to do good but its language was violent and uncalled for. He then criticised the younger newspapers and spoke very feelingly on the words which were to be found in one of them which were if not indecent, highly undesirable.

The Opposer, Mr. Omololu, then spoke in his usual breezy and witty style. He said he felt like the lawyer who, after listening to a three hours' speech by the opposing counsel, got up and said "M' lad, I don't think Mr.—has proved his case" and sat down. To which the Judge replied "Neither do I" and gave him the verdict. (laughter). He thought that instead of raming down the Press, we ought to congratulate it. The English Press, over 200 years of age was not perfect. Could we expect the Lagos Press to be so? We do not judge a man by his mistakes only. He defended the "Pioneer." The idea of its being controlled by Government was a mistake. It merely sought its information from the Government and used this. He defended the "Messenger." After all a paper must say what it thinks and not to be controlled by popular views. He asserted that on any reasonable view, the influence of the Lagos Press was wholly for good.

A very interesting and spirited discussion then took place. In view of the question at issue, the Chairman drew the discussion open to visitors.

Dr. Savage gave a moving speech. The Press should instruct, enlighten and guide. Was it doing so? There seemed to be a wicked attempt to-day to make people go astray. Editors to-day were not leaders—they were being pushed from behind. The scurrilous language of some of the papers was prompted solely for the sake of silly lucre which it brought. He thought it better to have no press than to continue as at present. His speech was loudly applauded.

Mr. Ikoli, then spoke. He said the Press of the whole world was suffering from the domination of the financiers. He instanced the Times and other English papers. The Press was not free. The Editor must say what his supporters wanted. A remedy would be the increased support of the Press by the public. At present he considered the influence of the Lagos Press a good.

Mr. Deniga, supported the Opposer. It was natural the Press would make mistakes. He defended the language of the "Eko Akete" and said it was but the reflection of the common language of the people.

Mr. Onajobi and Mr. Olaoju spoke, both supporting the Proposer. The latter stated the even in the last few years, the Press had degenerated, witness the Lagos Weekly Record which used to be a real force for good. One of the younger members then spoke in support of the Opposer—his long words (some of them longer than himself) greatly amused the audience. After the Proposer

had replied, the motion was put by the Chairman and carried by a big majority. The debate showed considerable powers of thought and expression among the members and should help to form public opinion as to what should be expected from our Press.

The next debate will be on March 22nd—(the last of the Session) "That this house considers that the Examinations are not a true Test of Education." Prepared by D. A. Onajobi Esq., and Opposer by J. T. N. Cole, Esq., LL.

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
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
