THE DECLINE OF A ONCE POPULAR JOURNAL.

"The Times of Nigeria" And Its Editorial Chair.

The reference made in the columns of a local contemporary has made us enquire for some copies of recent issues of *The Times of Nigeria* which, by the way, we were not aware has started coming out again.

It got up and ill-printed, this once popular journal excited a good deal of sympathy as one goes through its rough pages swelled up with grammatical irregularities and not bearing the appearance of being ever proof-read even from the printer's galley. With still more sympathy one looks back at the days of its glory when it stood out as a premier paper for Nigeria. Those were the days of the late Mr. Bright Davies, its founder, who sat in its editorial sanctum for a considerable length of time.

When it was transferred in the year 1899 to the Jamat Party, far-seeing people had almost then foreseen the decline into which the paper has now fallen.

After the death of Mr. Bright Davies, Messrs Walter L. Edwin and B. Ade, Memmeyen took up the roles of Editor and Assistant Editor respectively.

The paper then tried to show up—with men like Professor Adesoye Deniga, Palfiarch J. G. Campbell and others contributing to its columns—but with a marked change and only for a time, for the whole scene changed again and both the Editor and his Assistant left the office in succession. The present decline then actually dawned upon the paper and its Editorial chair began to be unstable. Messrs P. Peters H.A., and L. J. Backle came on the scene (one after the other) and left.

For sometime the paper went on without an Editor known to the public.

The proprietor Mr. Adam I. Aminasham, who is generally known at present as its Editor, does not possess the necessary qualification, educationally, that makes up an Editor, or, at least, a good one and we may humbly advise him either to engage competent hands or close up the business in the interest of good taste.

The paper, as it is now, does not reflect credit on the Lagos community. There is a philosophy in the saying that :—

Whatever is worth doing, is worth doing WELL.
