TO THE HONOURABLES

J. EGERTON SHYNGLE, ERIC O. MOORE AND C. C. ADENIYI-JONES.

Members of The Legislative Council, Lagos, Nigeria.

Gentlemen of The "Parliament of Nigeria,"

One of the very urgent questions which your Electorate would urge on you to lose no time in asking the Government at the Second Session of the above Council which has been fixed by Proclamation, for the 13th Proviso is the alleged shabby treatment to which some African Government Employees are said to be usually subjected in the matter of Accommodation whenever they are asked to take up duties in places other than Lagos in the Leeward, either temporarily or permanently by transfer.

More often than not, it is reported that in some cases, African Clerks sent abroad as previously stated, "On His Majesty's Service" are generally put at great pains in finding comfortable shelter in which to lay their heads; in other respects, it is said, they are obliged to make the best of a bad job by contenting themselves to sleep in open air, with scarcely any awning; again, it is given out, that sometimes some of these clerks are only too glad to share quarters with cattle!!! until they are fortunate enough either to secure lodgings on hire out of pocket--so I am told--or to be at the mercy of a casual friend, a chance fellow-countryman if you please, who will feel disposed to come to their rescue and thus save them from the ravages of the weather.

Moreover I am given to understand that in the case of Europeans who are similarly sent out, ample provisions are provided, in the shape of the erection of host-houses where there are no quarters originally, to say nothing of the comforts in which they are said to be rolling; this, in striking contrast to the lot of their fellow-coloured colleagues forthwith.

Quite recently the sad case of Mr. Atilebi of the Treasury (Lagos) who was sent to Port-Harcourt on duty and who, it is reported to me, owing to the absence of an accommodation, over there was obliged,--so rumour says--to find shelter in a shanty for few days which act, I am told, resulted in his being attacked with Pneumonia to which he succumbed consequent on the alleged exposure.

You, Gentlemen, I doubt not, will leave no stone unturned in investigating the various issues raised in this letter, and so save the country from disgraceful anomaly regarding this alleged treatment of some of the African members of the public service.

The country awaits your action thereon with undiminished confidence.

OFFENSIVE JOURNALISM.

In these days one does not know what the world is coming to.

The great war which was filled with atrocities and all sorts of brutalities unheard of in history—all garbed up in that pet phrase, viz. *Civilisation*—has lifted the thin veil which, from time to time, had covered a world of gross irreligion and sordid materialism. The ideal "Thou shalt not resist evil," is to-day in the melting pot and the principle "Ti for Tai" has plunged the world into an unusual perturbation. No more "live and let live." With individuals as well as nations the strong must always oppress the weak. To this state of universal unrest and uncertainty the journalistic world is not an exception. Foul language, with the malicious intention of holding up individuals or groups to ridicule and contempt, has been freely used in columns of newspapers by people who claim to educate the public.

Among a thousand and one signs of the present time is the recent libel action brought against Lord Alfred Douglas for publishing an untrue and defamatory writing against Mr. Winston Churchill.

But we are much concerned with conditions in Lagos. A local journal which sprang into existence last year, but which peralient pugnacious attitude and usage of abusive and ridiculous parlance has disgusted all sane readers has just said: "There is no healthy public opinion in Lagos."

It is simply plausible that the very people, through whose misjudging propensities the town could not progress, should turn round to rejoice in such disgraceful remarks.

Recently, one paper was strongly attacked by another for an alleged vulgar statement that the Resident of the Colony should be compuborily retired. But the latter contemporary in its review had nothing to offer the public but a lengthy rignarole more vulgar than the article complained of.

Lagos of to-day, more than ever, wants leaders of good taste and newspapers that would reflect credit on the race. The so-called ignorant mass are not so much at fault as their supposed leaders who, with *presumed intelligence and respectability*, will keep on jumping at one another's throat.

We sincerely wish things will take a better turn.
