To mark the occasion of the
assumption of His Honour Mr.
G. C. Whiteley, C.M.G., as the first
Chief Commissioner of the Western
Provinces of Nigeria, the Ibadan
African Club had a Tennis Tournam-
ent on their grounds at the War
Memorial, Iddo Gate last Saturday
the 9th instant.Among those present besides His
Honour and Mrs. Whiteley, were Mr.
MacKenzie the Secretary, West-
ern Provinces, the Hon. J. G. Kelly
M.C., Senior Resident, Oyo Pro-
vince and Mrs. Kelly, The Olubadan
of Ibadan, the Balogun, the Odi
Balogun, the District Officer, Capt.
Yates and Mrs. Yates, the Rev. D.
A. Williams, Councillor J. E. Lase-
bikan, Messrs Erewa, Ladipo Cole-
Ajomale, Pereira and many others.After the first two sets of games
on the 2 courts, a group photograph
of the principal guest with the
Senior Resident, the Olubadan, the
D. O and the Club was taken fol-
lowed by a short speech by Mr S.
A. Priddy the General Secretary of
the Club, who in welcoming the
Chief Commissioner and Mrs White-
ley referred to the sterling qualities
of Mr. Whiteley both as the Nigerian
Secretariat and as Administrator of
the Lagos Colony, whose fame had
already preceded him to the Western
Provinces, as witnessed the grand
send off accorded him at Lagos
on the eve of his proceeding home
on leave 7 months ago. He
expressed the Club's pleasure
in having His Honour with us in
Ibadan and the hope that the affairs,
of the Western Provinces and our
natural Rulers will make rapid
progress under his leadership.Mr. Priddy gave the the history
of the foundation of the Club by
Capt. W. A. Ross, C.M.G., as a
means of getting the local intelli-
gent people together and the sup-
port extended to the Club by
Ibadan Native Administration. The
Club was first named Ibadan Reading
and Social Club. It has had donated
to it by Sir W. Buchanan Smith,
former Lt. Governor of Southern
Provinces, a Cup for Tennis Com-
petition among African Clubs in the
Southern Provinces of Nigeria. The
Cup was first won by this Club,
then thrice by Bonin and last year
by this Club.In closing Mr. Priddy expressed
the Club's regret at the state of
war now existing between the
British Empire and Germany, ex-
pressing the Club's loyalty to His
Majesty's Government and readiness
to co-operate in any way that may
be required with prayers for the
success of the British arms and best
wishes for the success of Mr. White-
ley's administration and his good
health together with Mrs. Whiteley
during their stay here.

Chief Commissioner's Speech

Olubadan, Officers and members
of the African Club, and fellow
guests. I wish to express my
thanks to the African Club for
holding this tennis tournament to
mark the occasion of my assump-
tion of duty as the first Chief
Commissioner of the Western Pro-
vinces.I thank Mr. Priddy for the nice
things he has said about us. I am
afraid he is expecting too much
from me, and I am quite sure I
shall not be able to deliver any
thing like all the goods. But I
shall do what I can. My wife and
I greatly appreciate the kindly
feeling that has prompted you to
give us a welcome in this delightful
and enjoyable fashion.We have been in Ibadan barely
a month, but already we are be-
ginning to feel as if we are old
inhabitants, and the friendly
atmosphere of this afternoon's
gathering makes us feel more at
home.I have listened with interest to
the account of your Club's origin
and history. It has a useful and

important place in Ibadan society and from all I hear from outside sources it is most successful in achieving the objects for which it was founded. I offer you my best wishes for continued success, progress and prosperity, and I should like to say that I hope you will always call on me if ever you need any advice or assistance which I may be in a position to give I hope too that you will invite me sometimes to play tennis here with you, but on no account must you put me to play with your first pair—they are much too good.

Your Secretary has told us about this beautiful Cup, presented by the last Lieutenant Governor of the Southern Provinces, Sir Walter Buchanan Smith, whom we all know and remember with affection and admiration for the valuable and devoted services which he rendered to this country competitions of the kind for which this cup was presented are most valuable, because they bring together people of different interests and occupations and offer opportunities for "mixing" and rubbing off corners, processes which do us all a lot of good. I congratulate the Club on winning the cup for the second time. From what I have seen of your skill this afternoon, I fully expect you to win it again this year.

I heard with the greatest pleasure the pledge of loyalty which your Secretary has just given on behalf of the Club and on behalf of Government I thank you. As you all know it was only with the greatest reluctance and in the last resort when all efforts at a peaceful settlement had failed, that Great Britain decided that there was no other course open to her but to go to war. It is not for gain nor for any selfish motive that she has gone to war, but to defend those principles of Right and Justice and British Fairplay that have made the Empire what it is, and which alone have made the life of each one of us worth living. The struggle may be a long one, and probably will be along one, but all the peoples of the Empire are solid in their determination to see this thing through, and to spare no effort and no sacrifice to ensure the triumph of our cause, which is the cause of the whole of humanity and which we know without

any shadow of doubt or uncertainty is right and just, and which therefore must in the end prevail.

Out here in Nigeria we are far away from the places where actual fighting is taking place on land, on the water and in the air, and so the great majority of us cannot take any active part in the war. But don't forget they also serve who only stand and wait. That is our job out here to a large extent. We have all got to carry on as peacefully and calmly as we can, without fuss and without excitement. You can rest assured that if there is any thing we can do to assist our cause, we shall be told and our services called for. The ways in which we can assist will not be exciting or spectacular, they will I expect be chiefly along the lines of our ordinary civil occupations, and be connected with production of the raw materials required by Great Britain and her allies. Sacrifices and self-denial will certainly be called for, I am sure whatever sacrifices are demanded of us Nigerians, they will be readily and cheerfully offered. And this knowledge of the steadfast loyalty and determination of the people of Nigeria and of all the other peoples in the Empire is a source of comfort and support to the British Government.

The function was closed with the singing of the National Anthem. After which three cheers were raised for the Chief Commissioner and Mrs. Whiteley.
