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

Dr. Obadiah Johnson was born in the Village of Hastings, Sierra Leone, on June 29, 1849—a village famous for the great number of distinguished men it has produced. At the age of 8½ years he came to Lagos with his parents who were natives of Yoruba Country and was the fourth in the family of seven children. He received his elementary education at Ibadan and afterwards in Lagos under his elder brother the late Archdeacon N. Johnson. He afterwards began to learn carpentry for a time under the late Mr. Joseph Pearse, a Government Carpenter and a popular Builder and Contractor. He was sent to the Sierra Leone Grammar School for further education under the late Rev. James Quaker. After his Grammar School career, he became a teacher in Holy Trinity School, Kissy Road, Freetown, Sierra Leone.

From here he gained a C. M. S. Scholarship tenable at Fourah Bay College affiliated to the University of Durham and with Bishop Oluwole graduated in arts in 1879. The late Rev. N. S. Davies was the first Alumnus of Fourah Bay College who took the B.A. degree in 1878. After his College career, he proceeded to England and became a student of King's College London; here, he almost fell a victim to overwork while he was prosecuting his studies for distinction in science. From King's College, he proceeded to Edinburgh University to qualify for the medical profession, and after a brilliant career he took the M.B. Ch.B.; and returned to Lagos in 1886. On taking an appointment under the Colonial Government he proceeded to Sherbro, Sierra Leone, and there he worked for some time until he returned to join the Staff of the Lagos Colonial Hospital having as colleagues Dr. Rowland and Dr. John Randle. The Ijebu Expedition under Colonel Scott took place in 1892, he went up there with Captain Campbell—a man afterwards accompanied Captain R. L. Bowers to Odo Olin, and was there until an end was definitely put to the intertribal wars, and peace was established throughout Yorubaland through the efforts of His Excellency Sir Gilbert T. Carter. A few years after, he resigned the Government Medical Service and carried on his practice at Marble Hall, Broad Street, until he left for Sierra Leone on Christmas Day 1919. During the latter period he was able to devote his time and talents to the service of his God, his country and suffering humanity. He was a member of the Legislative Council during the

administrations of Governors MacGregor, Egerton and Luggard: his speeches and papers show him a brilliant scholar and an unselfish patriot. It was in the ecclesiastical sphere that Dr. Johnson shone brightest. One would have wished judging from the great interest he manifested in matters ecclesiastical, that he had been among the men of the cloth. He was a strong Churchman of the High Church type, and would not miss services on Sundays and Holy Days and other Church services except when duties or illness prevented. He figured prominently in the sessions of the Diocesan Synod of Western Equatorial Africa since its inauguration in July 1906. He has always served on its Board, and on its different Committees. He was a member of Christ Church Parochial and represented Christ Church on the Lagos Church District Council. He had been the President of the Nigerian Pastorate Association since its inception, and his last important work before the last session of the Diocesan Synod which he attended was when he read the Report of that Association and presented it to the Synod in September 1919. On Christmas Day 1919 he left for Freetown, Sierra Leone for the benefit of his health, while there, he lost his sister Mrs. Margaret Cole. He took a trip to England subsequently and it was the chill he caught on board on the voyage to England that has ended fatally.

The Community of Lagos in fact, Yorubaland has lost a brilliant scholar, an unselfish patriot, a staunch Churchman, a highly qualified and skilled physician and surgeon, and one keenly interested in the welfare of his country and race.
