THOUGHTS.

On the influence of the local Press, after years of scepticism, doubt, and anxiety about the moral value of the influence wielded by our local papers on the minds and manners of the community in Nigeria, I debate bearing on this extremely important topic was the debate of the Lagos Press, was held at the C.M.S. Grammar School Hall (on the 22nd July) by the literary and debating section of the Society of Old Okeopoposians. There is no necessity to go through the details of the meeting, judge it to say that the performance displayed by the Proposer and Opposer, Messrs. C. B. Oluomuyiwa and Onololu respectively [that the influence of the Lagos Press is not entirely for good] to show that the debate deserves to be ever fresh to the memory of all. The aforementioned debate can never be compared to its superiority, especially, and in its international applicability to the political, social, religious, economical, commercial and even financial phases of our national existence. The papers were dealt with one by one.

The *Western Pioneer's* boasts, described as "ambitious editor" yet was ably defended by the Opposer Mr. Onololu in these words: "It merely caught the information from the Government and used it! One opinion is that the Nigerian flower is worthy of emulation so far as journalism is concerned.

The *African Messenger* was defended by its Editor but ably by its Sub. Editor [Mr. Onololu] who was able Mr. Oluomuyiwa's Opposer.

The evergreen brilliancy of the *Messenger's* speaks for itself; a firmer policy, however, as intimated by the Proposer (Mr. Oluomuyiwa) might further enhance its already wide reputation.

The Lagos *Weekly Record* was discussed. Its high-falutin has always been very charming and engaging, and although there were certain objections about it, yet its merit as a thoroughly representative organ stands as at present.

The Editor of the *Eko Akete* (Mr. Deiga) defended his striking paper, being the first predominantly Yoruba (vernacular) paper.

The undoubted potentialities of the *Eko Akete* were also discussed.

The press should instruct, enlighten and guide. There seems to be a wicked attempt to-day to make people go astray. Editors to-day are not leaders—they are being pushed from behind. The scurrilous language of some of the papers was prompted solely for the sake of filthy lucre which it brought. Editor to have no press than to continue as at present.

As one of the subsequent speakers identified Dr. Savage that the press of the whole world was dominated by the newspaper, yet that newspaper does not absorb the price one got from their serious responsibility.
